

## ***I adopted a CCC registered cat but the Certificate of Registration is not in my name.... How do I transfer ownership?***

There are two very important reasons why your cat's Certificate of Registration should be in your name:

1. To ensure that the owner's information is linked to the cat in Canada's registry of pedigreed cats held by CCC.
2. To ensure that the owner's information is current in the *Pet Home Today* Canadian microchip database in order to facilitate your cat's safe return when lost.

You need to know that, legally, as indicated on the certificate, the previous owner (the person whose name is on the front of the Certificate of Registration) is responsible for the fees to transfer ownership.

### **How to transfer ownership:**

1. Write the information of the NEW OWNER (name, address, telephone number and email) on the BACK of the Certificate of Registration.
2. The signature of the PREVIOUS OWNER is required (the person whose name is on the front of the certificate).
3. Write the transfer date (date the cat is adopted by the NEW OWNER).
4. Calculate transfer fees including taxes (see information on the BACK of the certificate).
5. Mail the certificate with a cheque to the address indicated on the BACK of the certificate.
