## Morphological types

## There are 4 morphological types of cats:

- **1. Cobby:** Characterized by a massive, short and powerful body, a strong bone structure, a short and rather broad neck, a short and thick tail, a round head facing with a concave profile and round feet.
- **2. Mediolinear:** Characterized by a rectangular body, a solid framework but without excess, a clear but strong neck, a medium tail, an intermediate and balanced head, round or oval feet.

The Americans have subdivided this type:

 Semi-cobby: Body slightly longer than the cobby, with a strong bone structure

- Semi-foreign: Long and elegant body with strong bones
- Foreign: Lighter, the general structure is fine and elegant without being extreme
- **3. Long or oriental**: Characterized by a long and tubular body, a fine framework, a long and clear neck, a thin and long tail, a triangular head opposite with a convex or straight profile, oval feet.
- **4. Long and powerful**: stands out from other types by a body that is both long and powerful with a strong boning.
