SELKIRK REX

THE SELKIRK REX LONGHAIR AND SHORTHAIR ARE JUDGED AS TWO SEPARATE BREED.

The Selkirk Rex is the result of a dominant, spontaneous mutation that caused each hair to have a gentle wave or curl giving the coat a soft feel. Coat is curly from birth. Curl varies by gender and age. At about four month of age, kittens may lose their curls. The coat becomes curlier from 8 to 24 months. Full extent of curl will be developed by two years. Climate, as well as seasonal and hormonal changes can influence the coat's curliness. This is a medium to large cat with heavy boning that gives the cat surprising weight and an impression of power. The Selkirk Rex is an active cat with a sweet personality.

I – BODY/CONFORMATION (25)

(10) BODY — Medium to large and well balanced. Rectangular body. Substantial muscular torso. Straight back with slight rise to hindquarters. Shoulders and hips to have same width. Overall impression is neither not cobby or long and rangy.

(5) LEGS – Medium to long. Substantial boning. In proportion.

(5) FEET - Large, round and firm.

(5) TAIL — Medium in length and in proportion to body. Heavy at base, tapering slightly to a rounded tip.

II - HEAD (30)

(10) FULL FACE — Round, broad and full cheeked. Round underlying bone structure with no flat planes. Tip to chin lines up with the tip of nose and upper lip in same vertical plane. Muzzle medium width, rounded with well-padded whisker pads to give impression of squareness. Length of muzzle is equal to ½ the width.

(10) PROFILE — Nose has a downward slant with either a convex curve or a straight line, convex preferred. Well developed, firm chin. Muzzle short, clearly visible beyond curve of cheek.

(5) EARS — Medium in size, broad at the base, set wide apart. Fits into rounded contour of head. Ear furnishings are curly. Ear tipping desirable.

(5) EYES — Large, rounded and set well apart. Eyes on same horizontal plane when seen from front.

III – COAT/LENGTH (35)

LONGHAIR

(5) COAT — Long and flowing, the ruff is full and tail fur is long. Whiskers are curly but brittle and often break off.

(10) TEXTURE - Soft, cottony, full and wavy/curly. Longest hair forming a rippling or ringlet effect.

(10) DENSITY — Dense, full curls with no bald or thinly covered areas.

(10) CURL — Loose, individual wavy curls. Curliness, crimping or ringlets may be more evident around neck, tail and stomach.

SHORTHAIR

(5) COAT — Hair no longer that 1" (2,5cm). Neck ruff and tail fur are same length as coat. Coat feels thick and open wavy curls are not long enough to form ringlets. Whisker are curly but brittle and often break off.

(10) TEXTURE — Soft, plushy, full and wavy/curly with a feel of soft lamb's wool.

(10) DENSITY — Dense, full, open curls with no bald or thinly covered areas.

(<u>10</u>) <u>CURL</u> — Arranged in loose individual curls. Curls most evident on neck, tail and stomach.

IV - COLOUR (5)

All coat colours and patterns are permitted. Eye colour ranges from copper to green. No relationship between eye colour and coat colour. Blue for Colourpoints. Preference is given for depth, evenness and brilliance.

V – CONDITION & BALANCE (5)

Muscular, hard and well proportioned. Heavy and alert.
